Personal doctors and nurses are an important part of solving healthcare problems

The healthcare system is facing a number of challenges that require innovative and effective solutions. One such solution is the concept of self-care physicians and self-caregivers, which has the potential to significantly improve both the quality of care and the patients' experience. These specialized and personally assigned care providers play a crucial role in managing care needs in a sustainable way.

Continuity of care One of the biggest benefits of having a GP and self-caregiver is the continuity and stability they offer. Patients are given the opportunity to build a long-term relationship with their caregivers, which creates trust and security. When a doctor and caregiver know the patient's medical history and personal circumstances, they can offer more tailored and effective care.

Preventive care and early intervention GPs and self-care providers can also play an important role in preventive care. Through regular check-ups and a close relationship with the patient, they can identify potential health problems before they develop into serious conditions. This means that care interventions can be initiated early, which not only improves the patient's health but also reduces the burden on emergency care and other healthcare resources.

Efficient use of resources

Another advantage of personal doctors and self-caregivers is more efficient use of resources in healthcare. Having a central point of contact that coordinates the patient's care needs reduces the risk of duplication of work and unnecessary testing. The doctor and the carer know their patients, which speeds up all healthcare contacts. It also makes it easier to refer patients to the right specialist care when needed, saving time and resources for both patients and the healthcare system.



Improved patient experience Patients' experience of care is also significantly improved with GPs and personal caregivers. The feeling of having someone who is personally responsible for their health and well-being can reduce stress and anxiety, which in turn can have positive effects on their overall health status. A more person-centered care model creates a positive feedback loop where patient engagement and satisfaction contribute to better care outcomes.

Challenges and solutions Of course, there are challenges in implementing a model with GPs and self-caregivers. Adequate resources, training and support are needed for healthcare professionals to ensure that they can provide the best possible care. It is also necessary to have a

well-functioning system to match patients with the right caregivers based on their needs and preferences.

Both Kela and the Finnish Medical Association are in favour of a trial of GPs and nurses as soon as possible. Kela recommends that the funds earmarked for doctor's visit reimbursements be used for this purpose.

Will doctors' and nurses' salaries increase as a result of the reform?

Yes! Some. Those who want and can and who have the energy to work efficiently and for a long time receive higher wages. But some notice that the level of earnings is falling. And that any doctor or nurse would get paid by welfare county officials is probably unthinkable.

In conclusion, general practitioners and self-caregivers have the potential to become key players in solving many of the current problems in healthcare. Not the only component, but perhaps the most important. By providing continuous, preventive, and

people-centered care, they can improve the patient experience, streamline resource use, and facilitate other parts of the healthcare system. It is high time that this healthcare model was recognised and invested in better and more sustainable healthcare.

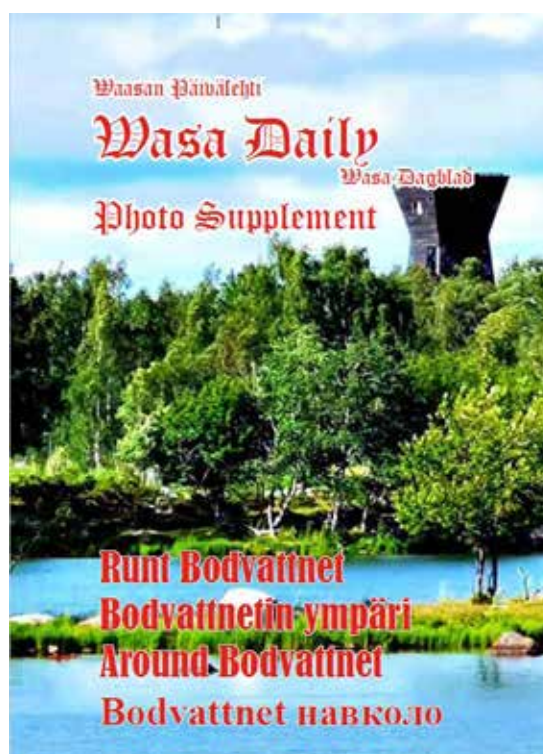
And we here in Ostrobothnia – surely better and more sustainable healthcare is deserved!

The well-known green mobility provider FlixBus opened a new bus route from Finland to Europe a year ago. This route connects passengers from Vaasa to Pori, Rauma, Raisio and Turku and offers connections to various

destinations around Europe. Now this popular route is expanding, as FlixBus will also start operating from Tampere and Joensuu.

Soon you will be able to take the bus from Joensuu to Hamburg, YLE recently reported. The company has applied for permits for new routes in Finland and also wants to transport passengers from Rovaniemi to Krakow and from Tampere to Vilnius. FlixBus' goal is to expand its operations further in Finland, and tickets for the new routes are already on sale. A trip from Joensuu to Helsinki costs just over 12 euros in August.



With its characteristic green buses, FlixBus flies in an impressive 40 countries in Europe, North and South America. Deer Hunting Permits Granted in Coastal Ostrobothnia

The Finnish Wildlife Agency has issued a significant number of hunting permits for elk and white-tailed deer in Coastal Ostrobothnia for the upcoming hunting season. This year, 1,711 permits have been granted for elk hunting and 846 permits for white-tailed deer hunting in the region. Elk Hunting Permits The Finnish Wildlife Agency has allocated 1,711 elk hunting permits for the Coastal Ostrobothnia region for this autumn. During the 2023 hunting season, 82.7% of the 1,173 elk hunting permits issued were utilized, resulting in a total catch of 1,304 elk. White-Tailed Deer Hunting Permits

For the upcoming season, 846 permits for white-tailed deer hunting have been granted. Last year, 1,088 permits were issued, of which 44.7% were used, leading to a catch of 670 white-tailed deer. Permit Details Each deer hunting permit allows hunters to take down either one adult deer or two calves.

The number of permits issued is determined by the moose population density targets set by the Regional Game Council of Coastal Ostrobothnia. These targets, which are specific to deer farming areas, are revised every three years.

For Coastal Ostrobothnia, the current targets are 3-4 elk and 1-7 white-tailed deer per thousand hectares. The allocation of hunting permits is a crucial aspect of wildlife management in Coastal Ostrobothnia, ensuring the balance of elk and white-tailed deer populations in accordance with ecological targets. By regulating the number of permits, the Finnish Wildlife

Agency aims to maintain sustainable wildlife populations while providing hunting opportunities for the community. With the new hunting season approaching, hunters in Coastal Ostrobothnia are preparing for a busy and productive season, contributing to the region's wildlife management

and conservation efforts.

Dragsvik safety: Pia Kauma worried about the safety of military service: Written question in Parliament



Member of Parliament Pia Kauma (National Coalition Party) has submitted a written question in Parliament on the safety of military service. According to him, conscripts and women volunteering for military service must be able to perform their service in safe conditions. Kauma refers in particular to recent accidents that have raised concerns about the level of service safety.

Concerns about service safety

Kauma's examples include a serious accident in the Uusimaa Brigade in October 2023 during a coastal jaeger examination, in which several conscripts were submerged in water, and the tragic accident during the night shooting exercise in Syndalen in Hanko in 2015, in which a student officer died. He also mentions the level crossing accident in Raseborg in 2017, in which three conscripts died and four were injured.

Otkes report

According to a report by the Safety Investigation Authority (Otkes), the accident in the Uusimaa Brigade was caused by several reasons, such as shortcomings in exercise management, contingency plans and the personnel's experience. Kauma emphasizes that it is necessary to ensure

that only people with skills and experience corresponding to the complexity of the situation are responsible for leading in particularly risky exercises.

Questions to the Minister

Mrs Kauma puts the following questions to the Minister concerned:

How does the Finnish Defence Forces intend to improve its command and control system so that, for example, a coastal jaeger can rely on the safety of the exercise in sea or other water conditions?

How does the Finnish Defence Forces intend to ensure that only persons with skills and experience corresponding to the complexity of the situation are responsible for command in particularly risky exercise situations?

How does the Finnish Defence Forces intend to improve the safety of conscripts and conscripts, especially in Uusimaa, where several serious accidents have occurred?

In what way are the service regulations to be reformed in terms of safety following the accidents experienced in recent years and showing that lessons have been learned from dangerous situations?

Kauma emphasises that every person entering military service must have the right to perform their service in safe conditions. According to him, this is necessary for Finnish society and the

reliability of the conscription system.

Broader discussion

Kauma's question highlights the need for a broader discussion on the safety of military service and the measures taken by the Defence Forces to prevent accidents. Military service must not only be efficient and prepare young people for national defence, but also safe and well-managed.

Kauma expects concrete answers and measures from the minister to ensure the safety of conscripts and volunteers during their service.

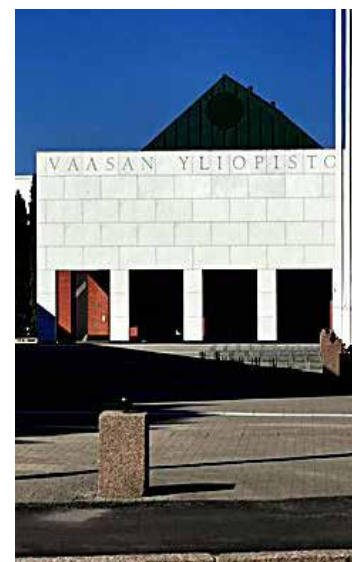

CLIMATE

Copernicus: June 2024 Marks Another Month of Broken Re- cords

June 2024 continued a disturbing
trend, according to data from the
European Union’s Copernicus
Climate Change Service (C3S). It
was the hottest June ever recor-
ded globally, surpassing the pre-
vious record set in 2023. This is
significant not just for the head-
line-grabbing “hottest month” ti-
tle, but because it marks the 12th
consecutive month where global
temperatures have been at least
1.5°C higher than pre-industrial
levels (1850-1900).

A Long, Hot Streak

While a single month of record
heat can be due to natural varia-
tions, a string of 12 months is ex-
tremely concerning. It highlights
the relentless rise in global tem-
peratures driven by greenhouse
gas emissions. This isn’t entirely
unprecedented - a similar streak
occurred in 2015/2016 - but it
serves as a stark reminder of the
urgency of climate action.

Not Just a Global Issue

The news isn’t all global. Eu-
rope also saw its fair share of
heat, with June 2024 tying for
the second-hottest June on re-
cord. This heat, combined with
other extreme weather events
we’ve seen this year, underscores
the very real impacts of climate
change being felt around the wor-
ld.

Looking Ahead

The record-breaking tempera-
tures of June are a worrying sign.
The high average temperature for
the past year (July 2023 - June
2024) is the highest on record.
This trend is likely to continue
unless we take significant steps
to reduce greenhouse gas emis-
sions.

Comments

This data from Copernicus is a
stark reminder that climate chan-
ge is not a future threat, it’s hap-
pening now. The continued rise
in global temperatures will have
far-reaching consequences, and
we need to act decisively to miti-

NATO-MEETING

Joint Statement on ICE Pact

President of the Republic of Finland Alexander Stubb, President of the United States Joe Biden and Prime Minister of Canada Justin Trudeau issued a joint statement on icebreaker collaboration in Washington D.C. on Thursday 11 July 2024.

As leaders of Arctic nations, Canada, Finland, and the United States, recognizing the enduring importance of the region to our collective economic, climate, and national security, we resolve to deepen our cooperation to ensure the polar and Arctic regions remain peaceful, cooperative, and prosperous. As part of this effort, we are announcing an enhanced trilateral partnership called the Icebreaker Collaboration Effort or ICE Pact.

Through ICE Pact, our governments will build on our longstanding and ongoing bilateral ties. As the first initiative under ICE Pact, we will commit to a collaborative effort to continue building best-in-class Arctic and polar icebreakers and other Arctic and polar capabilities in each of our respective countries by sharing expertise, information, and capabilities. Over the next six months, we also will jointly develop an implementation plan for this collaboration to build these highly complex and critical vessels for our allies and partners with interests and responsibilities in the Arctic and Antarctic regions.

This partnership will st-

ngthen the shipbuilding industries in each nation with the goal of creating good-paying jobs in shipyards, marine equipment manufacturers, and many other related services across all three countries. In the Arctic, new, faster shipping lanes hold the potential to create new economic opportunities and drive down shipping costs. And in the Antarctic, our partnership can also foster increased scientific research and international collaboration.

This partnership is about more than the collective production of polar icebreakers and capabilities, including Arctic and polar-capable ships. It is about providing the capability for like-minded nations to uphold international rules, norms, and standards to sustain peace and stability in the Arctic and Antarctic regions for generations to come.

UKRAINE

Endorsement of the Ukraine Compact Marks the Solemn Conclusion of the NATO Anniversary Summit

The 75th NATO Summit in Washington concluded with the endorsement of the Ukraine Compact.

During the endorsement of the Compact, speeches were given by

US President Joseph Biden and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy.

"In the short term, we will continue to provide Ukraine with the weapons, ammunition, and training necessary to repel Russian forces. In the medium term, we will help build the forces and capabilities to defend Ukraine and deter further aggression," stated Joseph Biden.

The President of the United States emphasized that in the event of another Russian attempt to attack Ukraine after the end of the war, all countries that have endorsed this document will support Ukraine.

Volodymyr Zelenskyy noted that throughout this year, active work has been underway on a robust security guarantee architecture for our country. These guarantees strengthen Ukraine but do not serve as a substitute for the goal of becoming a NATO member.

"I thank President Biden for his leadership and all the efforts to ensure that our security cooperation is filled with decisive actions. There are 23 strong agreements, and there will be agreements with other countries. We have a historically important security agreement with the United States," said the Head of State.

Should doctors save public primary care?

What is this house?

"There is less talk about the quality of care than about access to care, even though we use the quality register of the Finnish Institute for Health and Welfare. According to the Heart Registry, only 20% of patients with myocardial infarction have LDL cholesterol within the treatment target (7). This is an expression of the entire service system: treatment initiated in specialised medical care is not carried out appropriately.

The patient needs time to adapt to the disease and commit to treatment. They should be able to trust that the doctor is competent and has their best interests at heart.

A good doctor provides an explanation of the patient's problem that is sensible and acceptable in the patient's life. Meeting the patient face to face awakens a sense of responsibility; Then the doctor will have enough information and can do his or her best.

In Canada, the patient's risk of being admitted to the emergency department after a remote visit with a family doctor was 66% lower compared to a temporary telemedicine visit (8).

If the service system does not work for those who need it most, then there is a fault with the system. Doctors must save primary care and allow patients to come to the general practitioner's office. The GP system is the simplest, most honest, most high-quality and most cost-effective method in primary care."

SLOT MACHINES

THL: In the most vulnerable residential areas, the most money is lost on slot machines in their own area

In areas where deprivation is common, most money is lost on gambling machines in one's own neighbourhood, according to a study by THL. The availability of slot machines, i.e. the number of machines relative to the number of inhabitants, is also highest in the most deprived postal code areas, although the number of slot machines has decreased significantly overall.

In the study, deprivation referred to the low income level of the area, the high proportion of residents with only comprehensive school education, and the high unemployment rate. The data for the study are from 2022, when the total number of slot machines in mainland Finland was approximately 12,000. The number of vending machines had fallen by as much as 10,000 from the previous review carried out in 2018–2019.

In residential areas where deprivation is common and there are many vending machines, losses per capita are the highest. The availability of vending machines is most strongly linked to the low income and education level of the area's residents.

"You can think of this as a kind of vicious circle. The more deprivation there is in a residential area, the more people spend on slot machines and the more frequently there

are machines in the area. Money lost further increases inequality and the risk of gambling harm," says Senior Researcher Jani Selin from THL.

"The number of slot machines has decreased considerably due to mandatory identification and the pandemic, when shops, for example, removed them from their premises. However, vending machines are still more available in deprived residential areas," Selin continues.

More detailed regulation of the placement of slot machines needed

According to the Lotteries Act, the placement of slot machines must be designed so that the inconvenience caused by playing them is as low as possible. In Finland, the decentralisation model of slot machines is used, i.e. they are placed in everyday environments, such as shops, petrol stations and kiosks. There are also slot machines in separate gaming halls.

"The wording of the Lotteries Act on minimising harm is not realised in light of the results of our study, even though the placement of slot machines has been discussed for years," says Research Manager Susanna Raisamo from THL.

The Government Programme states that the possibility of moving the vending machines to separate premises will be investigated. The need for clarification has also been mentioned in the decision to set up the

ongoing gambling system project.

According to THL researchers, stricter regulation of the placement of slot machines is justified in order to reduce the harmful effects of gambling and regional inequality.

"As long as the placement of slot machines is not regulated but the decisions are made independently by the gaming company and based on business criteria, the concentration of slot machines in vulnerable residential areas will continue," Raisamo estimates.

First study of its kind

The study combined Statistics Finland's population data at the regional level with detailed consumption data on slot machine gambling. The results are internationally unique.

As far as we know, this is the first study based on accurate data on local residents' gaming consumption of slot machines in their area," Selin describes.

In addition, research results for Espoo, Helsinki and Vantaa will be published later this year.

"Our future research results will be based on region-level socio-economic data and anonymised gaming consumption data, so they will provide even more accurate information on the connection between slot machine availability, gaming consumption and socio-economic factors," says researcher Pasi Okkonen from THL. Mars moon Deimos

Mars has two tiny moons, Phobos and Deimos. Pictured above is Deimos, the smallest moon of Mars. In fact, Deimos is the smallest known moon in the Solar System measuring only 9 miles across. The diminutive Martian moons were discovered in 1877 by Asaph Hall, an American astronomer working at the US Naval Observatory in Washington D.C. The existence of two Martian moons was predicted around 1610 by Johannes Kepler, the astronomer who derived the laws of planetary motion.
